Welcome to our company.

Established in 2011, Black Swan International (BSI) is the regional leader and one of the largest providers of protective security and transport services in Papua New Guinea. BSI is a reputable and innovative partner to both private and public entities serving local and foreign government agencies and non-government organizations, multinational companies, the resource, construction, hospitality and manufacturing sectors, and other regional enterprises throughout Papua New Guinea.

Based in Port Moresby and with regional offices in Lae, Madang, Mt. Hagen, and Goroka, and operations through our 'Partner Network' which comprises local landowner groups in 20 other locations throughout PNG, BSI can deploy security services from most branches, providing broad coverage across urban, regional and remote areas.

BSI has a national workforce of over 1,600 personnel, covering a complete range of all in house self-sustained services and roles. Our approach is based on supporting our clients' operations to proactively address the risks inherent in their operations. We regard local knowledge and leadership as imperative to our operations and are committed to building the capacity of our local staff and partnering with communities to achieve shared safety and security outcomes.

Our Services

Security Services - BSI prides itself in the provision of professional, customized security services and solutions based on best practice and international industry standards. These services include static guarding, mobile patrols, access and egress management, armed quick response teams, security K9 handling, aviation security, corporate advisory services, intelligence reporting, atmospheric reporting and investigations.

Secure Transport Services – BSI's security services are further enhanced by our Transport Team, which consists of a fleet of over 175 vehicles including 4WDs, SUVs, buses, vans, trucks and VIP vehicles in Port Moresby and throughout the country. BSI provides a range of services including pick-up/drop-off (PUDO) staff transportation, GPS tracking and monitoring, VIP secure transport, ad hoc transport services, vehicle escorting and cash-in-transit (CIT). These services are supported by cutting-edge technology and our Quick Response Force (QRF) emergency response capability to ensure safe and secure travel across PNG.

Command and Control - Our transport services are supported by our Journey Management Control Tower (JMCT), which is further supported by a second layer of contingency in our National Operations Centre (NOC). The NOC is responsible for the real time monitoring of BSI's communications networks and electronic security operations deployed throughout PNG including GPS tracking of personnel and vehicles, CCTV & intruder, and duress alarm monitoring. The NOC provides BSI with the ability to deliver direct command and control solutions to our teams on the ground in support of our operations and our clients' requirements.

Electronic Security - BSI is also the leading provider of electronic security technology solutions in the region. BSI offers an extensive range of electronic safety and security services designed to meet the highest standards of our clients throughout PNG. BSI has an unrivalled capability to design, install, upgrade and provide ongoing service and maintenance of electronic security solutions across PNG.

BSI was established over 11 years ago and has grown in stature to become one of PNG's leading security providers. I had the privilege of joining BSI in 2021 and in early 2022, alongside the former General Manager 'Shane Harden', embarked on a journey to re-shape the company on a quest to become the Premier Security Provider in Papua New Guinea.

With a dedicated strong leadership team and a combined concerted effort from all employees taking ownership we have had a tremendous year. In March 2022 we successfully transitioned our Headquarters team to downtown on Champions Parade and installed a new revamped National Operations Command centre as the 24hr operational hub servicing all BSI clients. In December

2022 we embarked on a momentous challenge of relocating and combining our Fleet and Operations bases into one location at Saraga. Under the guidance from Anthony Milligan (Spike), BSI's Corporate Services Manager, and without any impact on servicing our clients' daily requirements the team managed a seamless transition over the festive period, in what can only be described as a truly remarkable achievement, due to the dedication, commitment, and outstanding teamwork from all BSI personnel.

From a business perspective BSI has been very successful, having been awarded several prestigious contracts including the United Nations and Kina Bank. In July 2022 we also engaged in a three-year sponsorship agreement with the SP Hunters which provides complimentary match tickets for our personnel to enjoy the games whilst supporting the SP Hunters. In what is traditionally perceived as a male dominated environment BSI has been very proactive in recognizing the achievements of our female colleagues and justifiably rewarded stand out performers with key management positions. Recently we promoted two female members to take over as branch managers in our our regional branches in Hagen and Madang which is testimony to their dedication, hard work, and relentless drive for personal achievement.

BSI has a very diverse culture and encourages all employees to excel in their roles and strive for their ultimate goals to which BSI provides additional support. We currently have two female senior managers attending the Business Coalition for Women (BCFW) Senior Executives Women's Program, which aims to provide women in executive and senior management positions to support participants in building their confidence, expand their skills and knowledge of business operations and establish networks with other women in senior positions in the private sector.

I have witnessed a genuine and n2023 and improvement in the morale of the workforce, which is a pleasure to see, and we will continue our commitment to improve on staff facilities, welfare and incentive programmes throughout 2023, and looking forward to another great year ahead".

Saraga Operations Base-Relocation

Black Swan International reached another milestone in the relocation of its operations base from Kanage (5-Mile) to the new Saraga(6-Mile) base.

Historically, the main guarding security teams were operating from Kanage (6-mile) since 2011 and transport operations from Pool 2 (7- mile) since 2021. However, officially opened on the 27th of January this year, the Saraga Operations base is now the central location for both transport and security operations.

The purpose of the relocation was due to the split operations of transport and security services and leases on those sites expiring. Noting that it was also very costly running two different sites it was an opportunity for BSI to explore other options and centralize its operations.

With the transition to the Saraga base, we have been able to provide better facilities for the employees to utilize and provided an enhanced working environment. The drivers now have a dedicated rest room complete with Satellite TV, fridge, air-conditioning and tea & coffee provisions. The main building ground floor services the guard force, with new changing rooms, showers, toilets, help desk area, supply stores and mini cafe bar. The newly combined VIP and Transport dispatch Center allows for better access and control of the drivers and the fleet. It took a little under two months for the actual physical relocation from the previous sites and we still have work in progress to finalize the overall final design. The new location caters for all the operational teams with a large modern open plan shared office space and training rooms.

Employees are adjusting perfectly with the new location due to its advantages such as direct oneon-one conversation with the management and co-workers with operations in the company carried out efficiently and collaboratively.









A year ago, Saraga was not in the picture, however, at the very last minute an agreement was secured, and this well-suited location is perfect for Black Swan International's main operations hub.
